As I write, we're in the middle of the anniversary of the Stonewall Rebellion that began on June 28, 1969 and continued for several nights in the Greenwich Village neighborhood in New York City, 56 years ago this week. When we celebrate Pride Month we recognize the importance of history in the making of our world. History isn't something that happened in the past, it's a way of understanding how we got to where we are today. We are all a part of history, writing it, living it, and ultimately, we're actors within the stories future generations will tell.

It's been a remarkable Pride Month at the Lakeshore with a successful series of events bookending the month.
